## Conquering the Annual Meeting: Tips for Students

ore than 13,000 public health professionals are expected at the 128<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of the American Public Health Association (APHA) in Boston, MA. The Meeting, which will be held from November 12-16, will be the showcase for more than 900 sessions and over 3,000 scientific papers. For many students who are attending the annual meeting for the first time, the size and magnitude may appear to be overwhelming. APHA can be a great learning experience, a way to meet many new people, and tons of fun, as long as you stay organized and relaxed. Here are some tactics for making the experience more manageable and enjoyable for all students.

First of all, remember that you cannot do it all! This meeting will be taking place all over Boston, and it is virtually impossible to see and do everything you want. Some find that trying to get back and forth between the varying hotels and the conference center can be time consuming and frustrating. It is helpful to pick one venue, hotel, etc. and plan to spend the day there. Limiting yourself to one spot per day eases the frustrations. By going through the final program and planning each day before it starts, you will be able to prioritize what you want to see and do.

Also, the meeting is the time to really see the broad scope of our profession. Use the meeting to attend scientific sessions that are outside of your current interest area, to broaden your horizon and perhaps learn about new ways to approach your topics.

Think about attending the Business Meetings and Socials for groups related to your section area, to learn about key players or developments. Sections are another way for you to get involved in APHA.

Interact with other professionals during sessions. Specifically during roundtable sessions. These are a great way to meet and talk other people in your interest areas.

By going through the final program and planning each day before it starts, you will be able to prioritize what you want to see and do.

Bringing along business cards (if you have them) is also a great way to network with current and future

colleagues at these sessions.

Identify where key people of interest to you will be presenting, ask them questions, see who else is attending the session who may be of assistance to you in the future.

In addition to scientific sessions, plan to spend a significant amount of time at the Public Health Expo. It is a great chance to visit booths, learn about organizations, agencies, other schools, and finally...gather a lot of fun goodies!

Last but not least, PHSC sponsors a number of programs and sessions where you will have the opportunity to meet students from all across the country. We encourage you to attend our welcome session on Monday from 4:30 to 6 p.m., our business meetings on Monday and Wednesday, other student sessions during the course of the meeting, and of course stop by our booth (#722) at the Public Health Expo. ## **Student Networking Tips**

S o, you're a regular at the Annual Meeting. Think you are an expert on networking? If so, use these tips as a friendly reminder. However, if the thought of having to network at the Annual Meeting keeps you awake at night, read the following tips carefully.

- **Be proactive.** Don't wait for others to come to you. This is the best opportunity for you to meet professionals and students from around the country and the world at one event. Don't pass up a chance to meet great people in your field!
- Always wear your nametag. Others may want to talk to you about your school and/or area of expertise.
- Remember your business cards. Pass them out to students and professionals alike.
- Make a list. Are there significant students or

professionals at the Meeting that you would like to meet? It is easy to get swept up in all of the activities and forget to seek them out. In the program, locate where they will be (or are likely to be) and then attend the event.

- Know what you're going to say. Mentally
  prepare an icebreaker or script the praise you
  will offer them for their work in the field. After a smooth delivery, you will appear confident and at ease.
- Ask someone to dine with you. Invite someone to eat lunch or dinner with you at one of the great eateries in Boston.
- **Be yourself.** Above all, be yourself. Talk about your interests and what you are studying. The individual(s) you'll be speaking with may have similar interests or introduce you to someone who does!
